IT'S NOT WORTH IT.

<u>Draws of the cheater's promise:</u>

- Looks extremely <u>appealing</u> but ends in misery 5:3-6 For the lips of a forbidden woman drip honey, and her speech is smoother than oil, ⁴ but in the end she is bitter as wormwood, sharp as a two-edged sword. ⁵ Her feet go down to death; her steps follow the path to Sheol; ⁶ she does not ponder the path of life; her ways wander, and she does not know it.
 - Current research confirms that sexual promiscuity is not a healthy lifestyle.
- Appeals to our <u>ego</u>: "You're the exception!" 7:13-15 She seizes him and kisses him, and with bold face she says to him, ¹⁴ "I had to offer sacrifices, and today I have paid my vows; ¹⁵ so now I have come out to meet you, to seek you eagerly, and I have found you.
- Promises no <u>consequences</u>: "We'll get away with it!" 7:16-21 I have spread my couch with coverings, colored linens from Egyptian linen; ¹⁷ I have perfumed my bed with myrrh, aloes, and cinnamon. ¹⁸ Come, let us take our fill of love till morning; let us delight ourselves with love. ¹⁹ For my husband is not at home; he has gone on a long journey; ²⁰ he took a bag of money with him; at full moon he will come home." ²¹ With much seductive speech she persuades him; with her smooth talk she compels him.

Why isn't the cheater's promise worth it?

- 1) If they tempt you to cheat they're capable of cheating on you.
- 2) If they tempt you to cheat they do not have your best interest at heart (even if they think they love you) 5:5-6

Her feet go down to death; her steps follow the path to Sheol; ⁶ she does not ponder the path of life; her ways wander, **and she does not know it**.

3) Ends in <u>regret</u> over squandered reputation, relationships, time, and money – 5:9-10, 22-23; 7:22-23

lest you give your honor to others and your years to the merciless, ¹⁰ lest strangers take their fill of your strength, and your labors go to the house of a foreigner, ¹¹ and at the end of your life you groan, when your flesh and body are consumed,

Proverbs 5:22-23

The iniquities of the wicked ensnare him, and he is held fast in the cords of his sin.

23 He dies for lack of discipline, and because of his great folly he is led astray.

Proverbs 7:22-23, 26-27

All at once he follows her, as an ox goes to the slaughter, or as a stag is caught fast 23 till an arrow pierces its liver; as a bird rushes into a snare; he does not know that it will cost him his life . . . 26 for many a victim has she laid low, and all her slain are a mighty throng. 27 Her house is the way to Sheol, going down to the chambers of

Action steps:

death.

- 1) Focus on the spouse you have or are praying for God to provide 5:15-20 Drink water from your own cistern, flowing water from your own well. ¹⁶ Should your springs be scattered abroad, streams of water in the streets? ¹⁷ Let them be for yourself alone, and not for strangers with you. ¹⁸ Let your fountain be blessed, and rejoice in the wife of your youth, ¹⁹ a lovely deer, a graceful doe. Let her breasts fill you at all times with delight; be intoxicated always in her love. ²⁰ Why should you be intoxicated, my son, with a forbidden woman and embrace the bosom of an adulteress?
- For a man's ways are before the eyes of the LORD, and he ponders all his paths.

 3) Learn from the mistakes of others 5:12-13
- and you say, "How I hated discipline, and my heart despised reproof! ¹³ I did not listen to the voice of my teachers or incline my ear to my instructors.
 - Think of your children. How will this affect them?

2) Remember that God knows all of your ways - 5:21

- Think of people who don't know Jesus. How will they respond?
- 4) Recognize you're capable of falling but Jesus is strong enough to $\underline{\textbf{keep}}$ you.
