Leadership insights

- 1) Leadership potential begins with self-awareness 13:14b The Lord has sought out a man after his own heart,
 - The Gospel gives us *proper* self-awareness.

a man of wealth. ² And he had a son whose name was Saul, a handsome young man. There was not a man among the people of Israel more handsome than he. From his shoulders upward he was taller than any of the people.

2) Leadership potential is accurately measured by God's scale – 9:1-2 There was a man of Benjamin whose name was Kish, the son of Abiel, son of Zeror, son of Becorath, son of Aphiah, a Benjaminite,

- Your view of leadership and leaders will affect your leadership potential.
- 3) Leadership potential is enhanced or limited by our obedience to God – 15:22 And Samuel said, "Has the Lord as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the Lord?

Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice,

- Even the prophet Samuel's leadership mindset needed an adjustment – 16:6-11a When they came, he looked on Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed is before him." 7 But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on

the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." 8 Then Jesse called Abinadab and made him pass before Samuel. And he said, "Neither has the Lord chosen this one."

⁹ Then Jesse made Shammah pass by. And he said, "Neither has the Lord chosen this one." ¹⁰ And Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel. And Samuel said to Jesse, "The Lord has not chosen these." ¹¹ Then Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all your sons here?" And he said, "<u>There remains yet the youngest, but behold, he is keeping the sheep</u>."
