### NO PARTIALITY WHEN IN ROME II ROMANS 2:6-11 Pastor Jeff Robinson

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### Romans 2:6-11

He will render to each one according to his works: <sup>7</sup> to those who by patience in well-doing seek for glory and honor and immortality, he will give eternal life; <sup>8</sup> but for those who are self-seeking and do not obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness, there will be wrath and fury. <sup>9</sup> There will be tribulation and distress for every human being who does evil, the Jew first and also the Greek, <sup>10</sup> but glory and honor and peace for everyone who does good, the Jew first and also the Greek. <sup>11</sup> For God shows no partiality.

### <u>Context</u>

- God's impartiality to all persons.
- Romans 2:6-11 answers the natural question from 2:1-5: What is the standard for judgment?

# <u>Truths</u>

1) God is impartial – 2:6, 11 *He will render to each one according to his works...*<sup>11</sup> *For God shows no partiality.* 

'Render' – guarantee of justice.

Q: How do you think your life stacks up?

Q: Why do you think that?

2) God's judgment is based strictly on works: Jesus' or yours – 2:6-8 He will render to each one according to his works: <sup>7</sup> to those who by patience in well-doing seek for glory and honor and immortality, he will give eternal life; <sup>8</sup> but for those who are self-seeking and do not obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness, there will be wrath and fury.

# What do these verses mean?

1) Is Paul is advocating works-based salvation? Is he saying, "Aim for these things and do them and you'll be right with God?"

Romans 3:20a For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight.

Galatians 2:16a yet we know that a person is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ.

Psalm 143:2

Enter not into judgment with your servant, for no one living is righteous before you.

- 2) Is Paul is giving a hypothetical situation? "If a person were to do these things, then they'd be right with God?"
- Q: What is our capacity for good works?

A: Helpful and morally praiseworthy? Yes! Salvific? No.

- 3) Is Paul is highlighting *real* obedience produced by God in the life of a genuine Christian? Is he saying, "God must be in control of your life in order for these good works to be in your life?"
- 4) Is Paul is illustrating God's impartiality? Is he saying, "No matter who you are, God renders to every person according to their works?"
- Q: If our capacity is lacking, what is the answer?
  - a. Moralist: Try harder! Romans 2:1-5
  - b. Maniac: Party hardy! Romans 1:18-32
  - c. Messiah: Turn to me and be saved, all the ends of the earth! For I am God, and there is no other Isaiah 45:22
- 3) God's grace is available for both Jew and Gentile 2:9-10 There will be tribulation and distress for every human being who does evil, the Jew first and also the Greek, <sup>10</sup> but glory and honor and peace for everyone who does good, the Jew first and also the Greek.
