JAMES 3:1-12



YOUR WORDS WILL BUILD UP OR TEAR DOWN.

One of the central themes in James is consistency. Followers of Christ should see their thinking patterns, speech, value system, and self-image continually looking less like they once were and more like Christ.

Inconsistency manifests itself in different ways:

- 1. Double-mindedness 1:5-8
- 2. Uncontrolled speech 3:1-12
- 3. Worldly wisdom 3:13-28
- 4. Arrogance 4:13-17

Speech & Consistency:

- Teaching the Bible is a dangerous calling 3:1
- Q: How do you avoid judgment from incorrectly teaching the Bible?
- A: Teach the distinctions between fundamental doctrines and the various theological positions within the "tent" of historic Christianity. Fundamental doctrines (virgin birth, infallibility of the Bible, bodily resurrection, return of Christ, salvation by grace through faith, deity & humanity of Christ) we hold in the closed hand but others we hold in the open hand (head coverings, forms of church governance, music styles, etc.).
 - Taming the tongue is a tall order 3:2-10
 - We all stumble in many ways 3:2
 - Controlling the tongue is top shelf maturity ('perfect' the result of trials and faith being tested 1:4).
 - Small bits control powerful horses 3:3
 - Small rudders control massive ships 3:4
 - Small tongues create big fires 3:5
 - Small tongues create big **pollution** 3:6
 - Small tongues are set on fire by **hell** 3:6
 - Various animals have been tamed by humanity 3:7
 - Small tongues are a restless evil 3:8
 - Small tongues are full of deadly **poison** 3:8

- No human being can tame the tongue 3:8
 - Small tongues bless God and curse people 3:9
 - These things ought not to be so! 3:10
- **Absurdity** of inconsistency 3:11-12
 - Fresh and salt water from the same spring? 3:11
 - Fig trees produce olives? 3:12
 - Grapevines produce figs? 3:12
 - Salt water produce fresh water? 3:12

Application:

- Become a follower of Christ through repentance and faith in Christ.
- Allow God to transform your vocabulary by changing your mind/heart by meditating on Scripture and loose your tongue with Gospel content.

Psalm 141:3

Set a guard, O LORD, over my mouth; keep watch over the door of my lips!

Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear.
